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## Typical Aromas/Flavors of some Grape Varietal

Even when each grape (or varietal) has its own characteristics, the resulting wine will vary in intensity depending upon climatic conditions, viticulture practices and vinification techniques. For instance less sun exposure usually leads to more vegetative, less fruity character of the wine. The aging in oak barrels is certainly determinant to achieve the further complexity of aromas/flavors known as Bouquet.

**Chardonnay** – Will display aromas/flavors of stone fruits (apple, pear, peach) and citrus (lemon, lime) when grown in cool climates, and will turn to tropical fruits (pineapple, banana, mango) under warmer conditions. Bouquet/flavors include butter, vanilla, smoke, toast and yeast depending upon its fermentation and/or aging in oak barrels.

**Sauvignon Blanc** – Its aromas/flavors are dominated by herbaceous (grass, lemongrass) and vegetal notes (bell pepper, asparagus, green olive) while fruitiness is represented by grapefruit zest or melon. Alias Fumé Blanc in the USA, it forms naturally firm acidity dry wines very versatile in accompanying the greatest variety of foods.

**Pinot Grigio** – So called in Italy, is called Pinot Gris elsewhere and is probably the best known "white" variant-clone of Pinot Noir, its aromas/flavors are delicately fragrant, lightly citrus (lemon) with hints of stone fruits (apple and pear) and mildly floral. It is usually harvested early to keep acidity for a tangy wine.

**Riesling** – Its homeland is Germany and it has an incredible ability to maintain varietal identity while reflecting the individuality of the *terroir*, it has a powerful and distinctive floral (woodruff, rose petal, violet) with stone fruits (apple, peach) aromas frequently mixed in mineral elements (flint, steel, petroleum) from the vineyard source.

**Cabernet Sauvignon** – Typically the aromas/flavors of this French varietal are those of ripe fruits (black currant) on herbal notes (bell pepper, pimento) and spices (ginger, peppercorn). Processing bouquets /flavors goes from vanilla when lightly oaked to smoke and tar when heavily and with age will develop cedar, mushroom-earth and leather.

**Merlot** – Also original from Bordeaux France its flavor profile is very similar to Cabernet but tends to be slightly more herbaceous overall and less astringent, thus giving a lush mouth-feel. Aromas/flavors include red fruits (currant, plum) floral and herbal elements (violet, rose, green olives) and spices (caramel, clove). Aging will bring truffle bouquet.

**Shiraz / Syrah** – Indigenous to Rhone France this grape forms intense wines with deep violet, nearly black color, chewy rich texture and often alcoholic strength, with aromas/flavors tending to be more spicy (Black pepper, licorice, clove, thyme) than fruity (black currant, blackberry) and developing underbrush flavors (earth, truffle) with age.

**Carmenere** – Is distinguished by bringing wines of deep red-violet color with flavors/aromas of red fruits-berries (raspberry, currant) a very strong herbaceous-spicy component (bell pepper-black pepper) and also a particular and characteristic chocolate note. In the last years this varietal has become Chile's own signature grape.

**Pinot Noir** – Its flavors/aromas are often one of the most complex of all varietals, intense in ripe red and black fruits (ripe tomato, strawberry, raspberry, black cherry) accented by a pronounced spiciness (cinnamon, saffron, mint) while truffle, mushroom, barnyard and leather expresses *terroir*. Its most appealing quality may be its soft velvety texture.

**Malbec** – With characteristics falling somewhere between Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon it forms wines of deep color, ample tannins and a particular fruit note (plum-like) that adds complexity to blends. It truly comes into its own in Argentina where is the major red varietal planted producing fruity wines with a soft, lush structure and spicy notes (anise).
